This will be the topic of the General Pastor's convention taking place in the last week of August. Whereas in many things we plan ahead, in Church matters we often only react, many times when it is too late.

When we meet as pastors we will look at facts, logical conclusions and predictions made by researchers. A lot will change in the next 12 years, and we as Church need to be prepared and ready to act, rather than to react when it is too late.

Apart from looking at what researches predict, this also means spending time in prayer, asking the Lord for his opinion and views on these matters. It also involves deliberation, debate and Bible Study.

The continuous readings in September are from the prophets Habakuk and Zephaniah. Both are faced with a situation that they warn about the road ahead to prepare the people, and then find that the people ignore their findings. The prophets were people with open eyes and ears - to God, but also to the events around them. Their warnings were based on facts and logical conclusions.

The New Testament readings from the Bible Reading Plan show us how Paul and others dealt with challenges and prepared the congregations to move forward. The passages from John 8-10 contain powerful words of Jesus that encourage us and show us that HE is in control! You will read the wonderful verses where he says: I am the good shepherd, and I know my sheep!

Church towards 2030 - may we move forward with open ears, eyes, a willingness to change where change is needed, to be firm where the faith or gospel is challenged, to be confident, because we have a Lord who gives us hope and a future!
