


BISHOPS June POST July13



We stopped at the large street market to buy a souvenir for my overseas hosts. As we picked up an item that we thought suitable, three or four vendors honed in on us: Buy from me, much cheaper! Look, come here! They were pushing and shoving each other aside, hoping to win us. Only a few minutes later my wife and I were back in the car - we bought nothing, and we have never gone back there since then.

"Lutherans believe that the Church of Christ is bigger than any single denomination" "As Lutherans we gladly join all Christians in proclaiming that Jesus Christ is Lord". These first and last sentences in ELCSA (N-T)'s pamphlet: "Why we are Lutherans" are important statements. All too often denominations have been fighting each other as if we were enemies. Somehow the prayer of Jesus (John 17) "that they may be one" was ignored, or reinterpreted to allow for antagonism, or to apply only to "our own group".

Jesus knew that his followers would fight each other. He had seen it amongst his disciples and knew that it would continue as the Church grows. A large portion of John 17 deals with this, and the urgent need that Christians overcome these and work together. Why? Because Jesus and the Father are one, but even more important: so that the World can get to know God.

There will always be disagreements amongst Christians - even within the same congregation. There will always be opposing doctrines on issues such as baptism, communion, priesthood etc. We are challenged to work together, to clearly proclaim that despite these differences, we have one Lord and Saviour, Jesus Christ.

Too many people looking for help and hope have been driven away by our pushing and shoving and claims of "better offer". The Church of Christ is bigger than the Lutheran Church. Christ has much more to offer than what we on our own can give. "Father, I pray that they may be one" - so that the world is not driven away but drawn to what Christ has to offer!

With this in mind ELCSA (N-T) Church council is engaging in talks with Lutheran sister Churches FELSISA and ELCSA, but also other denominations, so that we can together proclaim that Jesus Christ is Lord.

May the congregations of our Church also be actively involved in such closer cooperation in their respective areas.
