Report to the Synod 2023

Introduction

Brass Band Festivals

We celebrated the brass band festival in Wartburg as guests of the UELC congregation. It was a wonderful festival where the joy and relief of being able to praise the Lord together again was palpable.

A great gratitude is due to the UELC congregation for the wonderful arrangements and hospitality.

We also celebrated regional festivals in Kempton Park and Braunschweig, with the festival of the southern region coming up on 10 September in Bethanien.

The preparations for the centenary festival are taking shape. The festival is planned for 9-11 August 2024 in Hermannsburg and the whole church is invited.

Even though our brass band movement started the same time as the first Lutheran missionaries landed in the country our association started in 1924 with a decision to start an association of brass bands in our church.

The festival has been set over a long weekend so that we can expand the festival over three days and families can enjoy the long weekend with us.

Further, we are also planning to send a delegation of players to the next festival of the Evangelischen Posaunendienst in Deutschland in May 2024.
